The results across the board are outstanding and the entire Matric class of 2017 is to be congratulated:

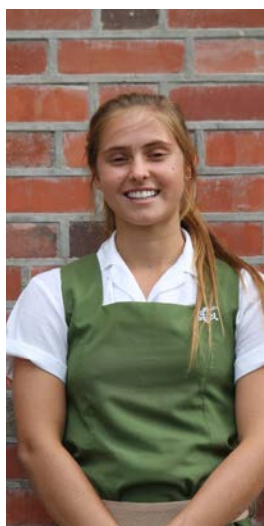
